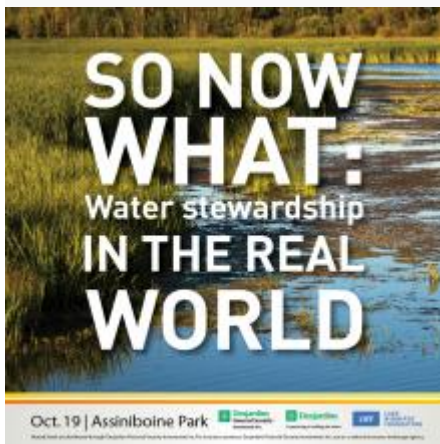


Oct. 12 (that's tomorrow!) with special guests:
