Pre-election [polling results](#) found nearly two-thirds of Manitoba adults agree that upgrading Winnipeg's north end sewage treatment plant should be "a very urgent priority." In the months ahead, we will continue to advocate Winnipeg's newly elected city council to implement an affordable interim retrofit to this facility that would effectively remove algae-causing phosphorus from our wastewater.
