As I have said before Lake Winnipeg must be saved and soon, but we also need greater action from all levels of government to address this issue.

I am committed to addressing this issue and believe that we must take action soon. In relation to question 1, you are asking that within 9 months of taking office that a major infrastructure project be completed. I am not certain that is possible, I am committed to seeing it through as soon as possible.

In relation to question 2. I have also made a strong commitment to ending homelessness, addressing addictions and helping with mental health challenges in Winnipeg. I am committed to bring the federal, provincial and state governments to the table to have these conversations about what we need to be doing. There is a net benefit to Winnipeg with the fresh water fishery and the ability to continue to provide high quality food to all Winnipeggers. Locally sourced food is very important.
